Biography

Giovanni Chiarini (JD, LLM, PhD with no corrections) is a Lecturer in Law at the University of Huddersfield and an International Fellow 2022-2024 of the National Institute of Military Justice at Washington DC.

Chiarini is also an experienced practitioner, qualified as a Defence Counsel at the Italian Bar Council and admitted to the list of the International Criminal Court assistants-to-counsel and to the roster of Counsels of the African Court on Human and Peoples' Rights. He previously carried out legal consultancy for the United Nations (UNAKRT).

He was a Scholar-in-Residence at Texas Tech University and Visiting Scholar at the Mississippi College School of Law, as well as an Assistant Lecturer at the Department of Criminal Procedure of the Insubria University of Como. He was a visiting researcher at the following universities: *Institut de recherche en droit international et européen de la Sorbonne*, Université Paris 1 Panthéon-Sorbonne; *Institute of International Peace and Security Law*, Universität zu Köln, Rechtswissenschaftliche Fakultät; *Centre for Criminal Justice and Human Rights*, University College Cork; *Laboratoire de droit international et européen*, Université Côte d'Azur; *Centre for International and Global Law*, University of Edinburgh; *Centre for Critical Legal Studies*, University of Warwick.

Chiarini was awarded Gold Medal for the best overall article by the Cork Law Review (Arthur Cox Prize); the prize for the best PhD candidate publication by the American Academy of Criminal Justice Sciences (ACJS); the prize for the best article on ecocide and mafia organized crimes by the Center for Studies in European and International Affairs (CSEIA); the award for the best LLM dissertation by the University of Parma.

He is a member of: the International Criminal Court Bar Association (ICCBA - The Hague); the International Society for Military Law and Law of the War (ISMLLW - Brussels); the Academy of Criminal Justice Sciences (ACJS - Maryland); the Italian Criminal Bar Association (UCPI - Rome).

Research Expertise and Interests

Chiarini's scholarship focuses on international and comparative criminal law and procedure, with special attention to the jurisdiction of the International Criminal Court and of the so-called Hybrid Courts. He published on the proceedings on an admission of guilt in the Rome Statute, on the international crime of ecocide, on the Russian invasion of Ukraine, on the case of Iraq/UK before the ICC, on the so-called war on drugs in the Philippines, and on the clash of legal cultures that characterize international criminal procedure from Nuremberg and Tokyo to the Hague. He is publishing a monograph with Routledge, entitled "The Evolution of International Criminal Procedure" (forthcoming, 2024).
