

Luca Leone is an Associate Professor of Agricultural and Food Law at the Department of Agriculture, Food and Environment of the University of Pisa, where he is also a scientific member of the Animal-welfare Body, which advises on the protection of animals used for scientific purposes. Before joining the University of Pisa, he was a Researcher at the Catholic University of Piacenza, where he taught Food Law at undergraduate, postgraduate and PhD level. During that period, he was Ernst Mach Research Fellow at the Institute for Advanced Studies on Science, Technology and Society (IAS-STS) in Graz (Austria) and IALS Visiting Fellow at the Institute of Advanced Legal Studies of the University of London. He is currently a member of the European Law Institute (ELI) in Vienna and of the Science and Democracy Network (SDN) of the Harvard Kennedy School. His research interests concern EU and global food law, the legal regulation of science and technology in the agri-food domain, and the issues relating to farm animal law and biodiversity law.
