Prior to that, Dr. Faleg was a Senior Analyst and Project Director at the European Union Institute for Security Studies (2018-2023). He holds a PhD in European Studies from the London School of Economics and Political Science (2014).

During his career, he has held visiting positions at several research institutions, including the Johns Hopkins University School of Advanced International Studies, the Stockholm International Peace Research Institute, King's College London; and has been a guest lecturer at the European University Institute – Florence School of Transnational Governance, the European Security and Defence College, the Institut national du service public (France) and the Instituto da Defesa Nacional (Portugal), among others.
