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## SHORT PROFILE

Camilla Borgna is Assistant Professor in Sociology at the University of Turin, Italy. Her research lies at the intersection of social stratification, sociology of education and work, and social policy. She holds a doctorate in political studies with specialization in public policy from the State University of Milan. During her PhD, she held visiting fellowships at the WZB (Berlin Social Science Center) and at the University of Arizona. Between 2014 and 2018, she worked as a researcher and later senior researcher in the Research Unit “Skill formation and Labor Markets” at the WZB. In 2016 she received a three-year grant from the German Research Foundation (DFG) to research inequality of educational opportunities in the reformed German tracking system. In the period 2018-2022, she was Assistant Professor in Sociology at the Collegio Carlo Alberto, where she coordinated the Master in Public Policy and Social Change and taught in the Allievi Honors Program. Her publications include two books published by *Amsterdam University Press* and *Il Mulino*, as well as several journal articles in the *European Sociological Review*, *European Societies*, *Social Science Research*, *Research in Social Stratification and Mobility*, *Journal of European Social Policy*, and *Journal of Youth Studies*. She is a fellow of the international network “College for Interdisciplinary Educational Research”.
