

### **Responsibilities of beneficiaries of Scholarships funded under DM 117/23**

According to Ministerial Decree 117/2023, Ph.D. students awarded these scholarships are required to:

- Comply with the provisions of art. 9 of Reg. (EU) 2021/241 concerning “complementary funding”;
- Fulfil the requirements associated with the PNRR measure under which the project is implemented, including:
  - Spending a term abroad of minimum 6 months, not necessarily consecutive;
  - Spending a term in an organization of minimum 6 months, not necessarily consecutive;
  - Completing six-month activity reports through the appropriate ministerial website;
- Fulfil the transversal principles and compliance of the activities with the relevant EU and national environmental legislation.

1. Digitalization, innovation, competitiveness, culture and tourism; 2. Green revolution and ecological transition; 3. Infrastructure and sustainable mobility; 4. Education and research; 5. Social, gender and geographical equality; 6. Health

According to DM 118/2023, Ph.D. students awarded “PNRR research” scholarships are required to:

- Comply with the provisions of art. 9 of Reg. (EU) 2021/241 concerning “complementary funding”;
- Carry out a research project on topics aimed at bringing significant knowledge development, including applied knowledge, in the areas of interest of the National Recovery and Resilience Plan (PNRR), in particular:
  - Green Transition, Digital Transformation, Smart, Sustainable and Inclusive Growth, Social and Territorial Cohesion, Health and Economic, Social and Institutional Resilience, Policies for New Generations, Children and Youth
- Fulfil the requirements associated with the PNRR measure under which the project is implemented, including:
  - Spending a term abroad of minimum 6 months, not necessarily consecutive;
  - Completing six-month activity reports through the appropriate ministerial website;
